# I'm Ready for Christmas

I'm getting ready for my favourite day of the year! This delightful story for preschoolers captures the magic of the festive season and summer holidays in Australia.

# **Christmas wrapping paper**

## You will need:

- Water based paint red or green
- Roll of blank paper or large sheets of paper
- Small flat tray for the paint (eg, plate or an ice cream lid)
- Glitter (optional).

#### What to do:

- 1. Spread out sheets of paper
- 2. Squirt paint into the tray/plate
- 3. Gently press child's hand into the paint
- 4. Gently press your child's hand onto the paper to make a handprint and repeat. Try not to put too much paint in one place as the paper may tear
- 5. Try using feet prints too but beware of falls as it can be guite slippery
- 6. Optional: while paint is still wet sprinkle the glitter on
- 7. Allow to dry before using as wrapping paper.

# Other ideas

Cut the printed paper into smaller gift tags, tree ornaments or Christmas cards and help your child to decorate or write a 'message' to someone special.

Use found natural objects from the garden or park (leaves, flowers, sticks) and try 'printing' them onto the paper, to see the patterns and shapes.

#### **STEM Focus**

Young children need real, meaningful experiences to learn. Preparing for special celebrations together is a great way to grow their curiosity by introducing and exploring new ideas and opportunities. When children are regularly part of these activities then it begins to build a strong foundation for future learning.

## Songs to sing
