- Demonstrate how to use the scissors. Support by allowing the child to try for themselves but assist where they need. Cut around the carrots following the dotted line.
- · Carefully cut an opening on the 2nd template
- Plant your carrots and have only the leafy tops sticking out of the ground. What can you notice?
- Talk about different sizes order the carrots from smallest to largest.
- Language extensions: small, tiny and large, thin and wide, short and long.


Growing, growing, little plants So exciting, I could dance! Just like magic, watch them grow I love to watch our garden grow!
