Touch and Learn

You will need:

- Basket with low sides
- A range of objects that are soft, hard, spikey, shiny, fluffy

What to do:

- Choose a time when baby is ready to engage.
- Ensure all items are clean and baby safe.
- Encourage baby to explore the objects.
- It's ok if objects touch baby's mouth as this is a way to sense and learn for babies (always supervise for safety).
- Name the objects by showing them to baby, holding them and letting them . touch the object as you name it.
- Describe the object with a word like soft, hard, or whatever suits the objects you have chosen.
- Have fun together by following baby's interest and allowing them to spend as much time as they need with each object.

Milestones:

By the time baby is 3 months old baby should:

- While lying on back, attempt to reach for a toy held above their chest
- Visually track a moving toy from side to side

At 6 months

Reach for nearby toys while on tummy

At 7-9 months


Investigate shapes, sizes and textures of toys and surroundings

At 10-12 months

Explore toys with hands, fingers and mouth
