



TWO TURTLES Kiah Thomas and Jake A Minton

For a tale about two turtles, this one is fast-paced! Frank and Terrence, two thrill-seeking turtles, will do anything to be 'the best'.

As Terrence and Frank defy gravity they learn some important life lessons! This action-packed story is bound to bring a smile to your child's face and may spark discussions about the importance of winning... or not!



Read with expression and have fun with this wonderfully playful text! There is plenty of opportunity to do so right from the beginning! Slow down, point to the pictures and give your child time to think about what is happening in the story. Encourage them to predict what will happen next. This will help your child to develop critical thinking skills as they learn to 'read the pictures', and build their comprehension.



Talk about how Frank and Terrence worked together. Look at the illustration - what did they use to make the parachute? Talk about how winning or 'being the best' may feel good, but it's how you got there and what you achieved along the way that really counts! Learning to work with others is an important life skill. Think about some daily tasks you can do together with your child, that could be turned into a game, like matching socks or sweeping the floor. Create and Play

- Make a Terrence or Frank hand puppet. Roll up, roll up - tickets please! Have a puppet show and re-create the story.
- Think about different ways you could race by moving in different ways. Crawl, jump or wiggle to the finish line!
- Try a race at a different pace! Change the speed - try a snail's pace, a turtle's pace or a tiger's pace!
- 1,2,3 ... Wheeeee! Learn about gravity with some parachute fun!

Make a parachute from simple materials in your home. Head to page 9 to see how it's done.

• Eye Spy

Open and close your eyes - open them wide, look to the left, look up, look down! Choose a page and see if you can copy the bird's eye in the illustration.



Learning

Language activities like puppet shows provide children with an opportunity to build language skills and to use new knowledge in a meaningful way. Make your own turtle puppets (template on the following page) and let your child take the lead with the storyline - and enjoy their reimagining of the plot! It is also a fun way to practice having 'conversational turns'. You can role model this with your child using the puppets. Use them to demonstrate how to listen and respond, it will help to build their communication skills! Sometimes just making sounds as you play is enough - think about some sounds you might make as Terrence falls over the cliff! Ahhhhhhhh!

Curl up and tuck your head in like a turtle


• Now sitting on your bottom, can you squeeze yourself into a ball, then slowly stretch out each limb and then, lift up your head.



Make some tickets and popcorn!











Make your own Two Turtles hand puppets

a turtle or other types of wildlife.




Make a magic potion

Ready, set ... SLOW!








Will you be Terrence or Frank? Choose your turtle band and see who can be the SLOWEST to the finish line. Follow these steps...
